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1. Peelian Principles – The Principles Which Modern Day Policing is Based Upon

- The public is responsible for its own safety and security. Law enforcement is primarily responsible for the physical enforcement with public approval and the diminished amount they must use physical enforcement and are able to obtain voluntary compliance goes to their success.

2. Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design (CPTED)

- Layering security and understanding the use of crime prevention tools and resources as a process allows both the public and law enforcement to learn how to influence the offender's behaviors before they commit criminal and nuisance acts

3. Network With Peers Beyond the Department for Education and Sharing Best Practices

- As a significant number of seasoned department personnel have left, there is great opportunity in networking with other organizations and departments for peer-to-peer learning and best practices.
